20 June 2024 - Her Excellency Ambassador of the Philippines Maria Lumen B. Isleta joined the ASEAN Trade and Food Fair, on 15 June 2024 (Saturday), held at the grounds of the Embassy of Malaysia and Royal Thai Embassy in central Stockholm, Sweden.

Under the coordinatorship of the Embassy of the Philippines, the event was a collaboration between the six (6) ASEAN embassies comprising the ASEAN Committee in Stockholm (ACS), in a bid to showcase products from their respective countries, share the flavours of of different

Asian cuisines, present the talents of ASEAN nationals through dance and song performances, and generally showcase an atmosphere of ASEAN hospitality, friendship and solidarity.

The Philippine booth included a display of merchandise products from Filipiniana AB, Timi of Sweden, and ResCion Design. Philippine chefs - Ms. Luwi Ms. Maryrose Seray - were also invited to showcase and sell Philippine dishes such as *pansit sotanghon*, *kwek kwek*, *siomai*, *sisig*, *dinuguan*, and chicken barbeque. Both chefs' sweet delicacies – i.e., *ube ensaymada*, *biko*, *turon*, egg tart, *puto* cheese, and *sapin-sapin* were also a hit with the public.

Highlight of the fair were the cultural presentations from the participating Embassies, such as Indonesia's Line Dance Maumere; Lao PDR's traditional dance, Dork Jampa (Flower of National); Malaysia's Sumazau Dance; Thailand's traditional dance, Fon Klong Yao; and a song number by Viet Nam. Mr. Rene Salazar of the Philippine Embassy serenaded the crowd with his rendition of songs.
